*People will **forget what you did.***


*People will **never forget how you made them feel.***

Hannah Marti of Minooka Community High School. Her mother is Margaret Marti, a teacher at J. Sterling Morton West High School, District 201.

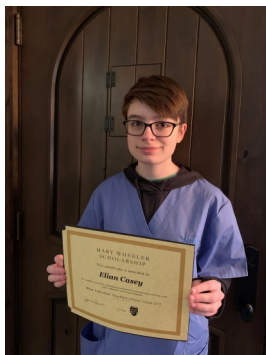
Kevin Murphy of Lyons Township High School. His father is Timothy Murphy, a teacher at West Leyden High School, District 212.

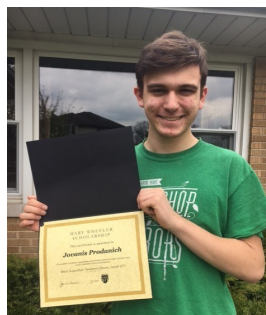

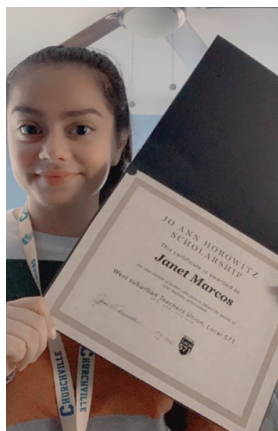

A virtual **AFT PSRP Conference** was held on April 23-24, 2021, offering tools PSRP members need to help strengthen their Union for the challenges we now face with COVID-19, reopening schools, and the ongoing fight for dignity, respect and living wages.

Marcia Watson, Proviso PSRP Council and Local 571 Area Trustee, participated in the two-day event and commented, “What I took most from the conference is to continue to let the support staff know that they matter. It is important to stress the impact that support staff plays in the motivation of our students. I plan to remain positive and informative to the membership.”

Five women from councils in Local 571 won their election on April 6, 2021, to the school board in their community.

Congratulations for stepping up and participating on behalf of students and education workers!

Jennifer Turn, an Argo High School teacher was elected to Cook County School District #130 Board of Education, a PK-8 district in Blue Island.

Betsy Keller, an Argo High school teacher, and first- time candidate, was elected to the Bourbonnais Elementary School District #53 Board of Education.

Luz Rangel Raymond is a teacher in Argo-Summit and was elected to the Argo Community High School, Dist. 217 Board of Education. Luz explains why she ran.

“I ran for the Argo Community High School Board for the same reason I became a teacher — to make a difference. I am an openminded, positive, and accessible individual. My vocation is one where keeping the students’ best interest in mind is a priority and advocating for all is my belief. I want to make sure all students have equal access to a high-quality education. My intentions are to be a team player and offer a unique perspective based on my personal experiences and skills, particularly when it comes to racial equity and social justice.”

Lori Parthimos from Leyden Council, a high school teacher, won a seat on the Bensenville Elementary School District #2 Board of Education. When asked, “How do you hope to make a difference?”, Lori replied, having had an interesting experience.

“I felt as if there was a lack of transparency and accountability, and I wasn't clear on the financial security of the district. I threw my hat in the ring for the 2019 election, and that resulted in a flat-out tie. Sadly, the outcome of the coin flip was a loss for me. While I lost that election, I gained a valuable lesson in why every vote really does count! Some of the questions I initially had, when I first moved to the community, still remained unanswered. With the support of my former opponent, and now friend, I decided to look past the pandemic and stay focused on financial stability and transparency. I think one of the most impactful supports was gaining the respect and support of our local Teacher's Union in Bensenville. Also, their efforts during my campaign cast a net over a wide audience that I don't think I could have done on my own under these restricted circumstances. I am thankful that I was able to gain their favor and support. I am looking forward to serving my community as a board member, and hope that I represent all of my associations in a way that makes them proud.”

Rachel Marroquin, an Argo-Summit K-4 STEAM teacher, was elected to the Evergreen Park District #124 Board of Education. The candidates were asked questions and posted on the board website. This is one of Rachel’s responses to the question posed.

What are your reasons for seeking a position on the Board?

“I want to be more involved in the decisions made for our children and teachers in Evergreen Park School District 124. I feel that working for an attorney, being a teacher, a mom, and a community member are all helpful to me being able to put my best foot forward in the job at hand. I have an open ear and a willingness to communicate my beliefs and feelings. I am hoping to be a positive addition to the team. I believe it takes a village to make things the best they can be. I am excited about becoming a part of that village and hoping that all parties at hand are able to learn from one another.”



Legislative Director Report Max Schoenberg and Nicole Burr

Local 571 Members - Make Your Voice Heard about Time to Play:

SB 654 would amend the School Code to require all public schools to provide at least sixty minutes per day of supervised, unstructured, child-directed play for all students in grades K-8. Play time would not count towards PE, and PE would not count as play time. Students with disabilities would be brought into play time in an inclusive manner. Withholding of play time as a disciplinary measure would generally be prohibited.

April 23 was the deadline for bills to cross from the House to the Senate and vice versa. Legislative efforts will now shift to readying bills for final passage and crafting the FY22 State Budget. As of now, the General Assembly continues to be on track to adjourn by the May 31 deadline.
